Small Group Guidance

Title of Lesson: Howard B. Wigglebottom Listens To His Heart: Self-Esteem Small Group Domain: Personal/Social Grade Level: K-5 Time Required: 30 minutes

Essential Question: What do I appreciate about myself? What am I good at? Why is it important to recognize our strengths?

Material/Resources: <u>Howard B. Wigglebottom Listens to His Heart</u> by Howard Binkow on the smartboard <u>www.wedolisten.com</u> or the book, paper strips

Activity:

 Preview the essential questions with the students and let them know you will be discussing them after reading the book.

Introduce and read (or watch on the smartboard) <u>Howard B. Wigglebottom Listens to his</u>
 <u>Heart</u>

During reading and after, review and answer the essential questions with the group.

Choose from any one of the activities below to complete group:

K-2

- O Have students write or draw 5 strengths or skills they believe they possess on paper strips. Allow for students to share with the group, then use them to create a paper chain. Process the commonality of any strengths the group members share to build group unity & foster self-esteem.
- 3-5
 Have the students list out 10 strengths/activities on 10 strips of paper, ranking them from most to least liked. Ask them if they like what they see and who they are; then have them remove a strip to "give up" a strength, asking if they like what they see/who they are when giving up a trait. Continue "giving up" traits and assessing whether they like who they are, processing their feelings & thoughts. Allow students to "add in" their traits, again processing if they like who they are.

K-5

Students make a collage using pictures and words from magazines to display anything they would like to share about themselves, focusing on skills/talents they believe they are good at.

o Share their collages and talents with the group.
